1 Family Health Clinic

Family Health Clinic exists to ensure affordable, culturally-appropriate, high-quality health and wellness services. A staff of physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, nutritionists, interpreters, and case workers provide quality care to infants and children birth to 21 years of age living in Warren County and surrounding counties. The Warren County Health District (WCHD) also serves adults age 21 years of age and over living in Warren County. To schedule an appointment, call 513-695-1468 or 513-695-1229.

2 Immunization Clinic

WCHD provides vaccinations for both adults and children. To see the full list of vaccines that WCHD offers, visit warrencohealthoh.gov/healthcare/healthcare-vaccine-fees. This clinic is open Monday- Friday, from 7:30 AM- 4:00PM. Please call 513-695-1468 to schedule an appointment.

3 Prenatal Clinic

The Prenatal Clinic exists to provide comprehensive prenatal and postpartum care for women regardless of age or income. Prenatal care consists of physician exams, routine laboratory tests, nutrition counseling and social consults. All deliveries and sonograms are provided by Bethesda North Hospital. 4 Reproductive Health and Wellness Clinic

The Reproductive Health and Wellness Clinic exists to provide services to ensure affordable comprehensive healthcare services to Warren County and the surrounding counties for health promotion and disease prevention. Services included are pregnancy tests, medical exams, pap tests, contraceptives, and STD education. To schedule an appointment, call 513-695-1263.

5 STD Clinic

WCHD's Sexually Transmitted Disease Clinic provides STD screening, examination, evaluation, counseling, and treatment. To schedule an appointment, call 513-695-1263.

6 Tuberculosis Program

The Tuberculosis Program controls the spread of tuberculosis (TB) in Warren County. We offer TB screening, active TB treatment, and latent TB treatment. TB skin test for adults and children are performed on Monday, Tuesday, and Friday from 7:30AM-12:00PM and 1:00PM-3:30PM. TB blood test is also available. 7 HIV Testing Clinic

HIV/AIDS Prevention Programs concentrate on prevention through confidential and anonymous testing, education, counseling, evidenced based interventions, community planning, and oral quick test results within 20 minutes. To schedule an appointment call 513-695-1263.

8 International Travel Clinic

Do you need to travel out of country and need a vaccine to enter? WCHD can administer these vaccinations. To schedule an appointment, call 513-695-1262 or 513-695-1467.

Community Health

1 Project DAWN

WCHD is part of the Project DAWN opioid overdose education and Narcan (naloxone) distribution network of programs coordinated by the Ohio Department of Health. If you are interested in receiving FREE Narcan, fentanyl test strips, and education, please call 513-695-1271 to get started.

2 Ohio Buckles Buckeyes Program

Ohio Buckles Buckeyes is a child passenger safety seat program that provides child safety seats to income eligible families. If you have any questions or want to see if you qualify, please call 513-695-1272.

3 Cribs for Kids Program

WCHD offers pack-n-play portable cribs at no cost to eligible Warren County families in order to provide a safe sleep space for their infant (under one year of age). Safe sleep education is also provided. If you have any questions or want to see if you qualify, please call 513-695-2475.

4 Prevent Blindness

Prevent Blindness provides assistance in receiving free eye exams and eye glasses for qualified individuals. To learn more about this program or to see if you qualify, please call 513-695-1272

5 Health Education

The Health Education Program keeps the community informed of important health issues and implements services/programs to improve the health, safety and wellness of citizens in Warren County. 6 Complex Medical Help

Families who have children with a chronic illness or physical disability may be receiving services from BOTH Medicaid and the Bureau for Complex Medical Help (CMH) program. You do NOT have to receive services from Medicaid to be eligible for CMH. Call 513-695-1535 for more information.

7 Disease Investigation

Communicable disease surveillance and investigation is a vital part of protecting the health and well-being of the citizens of Warren County. These surveillance and investigation activities are largely dependent on prompt disease reporting from many reporting sources. As required by law, physicians, hospitals, labs and healthcare providers must report certain communicable diseases to the Health District. Communicable disease reports received by WCHD are investigated and documented according to state guidelines. All reports received are kept confidential according to HIPAA requirements. 1 Household Sewage Treatment Systems

The WCHD Sewage program staff work with contractors and homeowners to ensure that all households served by residential systems are properly installed, maintained, and do not create nuisance conditions.

2 Private Water System Program

WCHD assists households with private water systems such as wells and cisterns by overseeing the installation of new systems, providing technical assistance, and conducting water quality testing when requested.

3 Food Safety Program

Public Health Inspectors work with the operators of every restaurant, grocery store, mobile food unit, vending machine, and temporary food operation to prevent the spread of foodborne illness through routine inspections, complaint investigations, and consultations.

4 Public Swimming Pool/Spa Program

WCHD staff members inspect public swimming pools and spas across the county on a monthly basis to check for water quality, pool safety, and to prevent the spread of waterborne diseases.

5 Campground Program

Every campground, RV park, and resident camp in Warren County is inspected on an annual basis to ensure they are clean, safe, and have a sanitary environment.

6 Nuisance Complaint Program

Environmental health professionals investigate complaints received from citizens regarding public health nuisances such as the improper accumulation of trash/refuse, pests, sewage illegally discharging in road ditches, and unsanitary housing conditions.

7 School Environment Inspection Program

Public Health Inspectors work with every school district in Warren County to ensure that the students are able to learn in an environment free from public health hazards.

8 Other Environmental Health Programs

The environmental health division conducts other programs in Warren County such as the enforcement of the Ohio's Smoke-Free Workplace rules, rabies investigation, application of mosquito larvicide on a complaint basis, and surveillance for West Nile virus. The environmental health staff also conducts educational programs and technical services on a variety of topics regarding environmental health to both the regulated community and service clubs.

Plumbing Division

The duties of the Plumbing Division of the Warren County Health District include plan review for plumbing in commercial buildings, inspection of the plumbing work through all phases of construction, and final approval of the plumbing work prior to occupancy. The Plumbing Division is responsible for protecting the water supply by ensuring, through plan review and inspections, that the plumbing has no cross-connections or possibility of backflow. The plumbing inspectors are also responsible for ensuring the waste plumbing is properly vented and trapped so the plumbing safely carries waste away while causing no health problems. The Plumbing Division was assigned the task of administering Warren County's Backflow Prevention Program. The program serves to protect the public water supply from contamination.

WCHD employs five State of Ohio Certified Plumbing Inspectors. By law, only State Certified Plumbing Inspectors can inspect commercial plumbing work. The five plumbing inspectors are responsible for plan review and inspection of all commercial plumbing work in Warren County. They are also responsible for inspections of all residential plumbing work in Warren County.

In addition to the aforementioned duties, the five plumbing inspectors provide technical consulting services to homeowners installing their own plumbing. They also work closely with the Environmental Health Division on plumbing related problems in restaurants and grocery stores.

Vital Statistics

WCHD provides certified copies of birth records for all Ohio counties and death records for deaths occurring within Warren County excluding Atrium Hospital. The fee for all certified records is \$22.00 per copy. Checks and money orders should be made payable to the WCHD. All personal checks now require the following to be placed on the check: Birth Date and a State issued identification number from a Driver's License, State ID, Military ID, or Passport. Credit Cards are also accepted in the office with an additional fee.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program

WIC is the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children up to age five. This program is funded by the United States Department of Agriculture. WIC helps low-income pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants and children who may be at risk for health problems due to inadequate nutrition. Women and children eligible for the program receive coupons which enable them to receive milk, cheese, eggs, cereal, fruit juices, peanut butter and infant formula from participating grocery stores.

Nutrition education is also given to the participants of the WIC Program. Educating the clients about diets, food buying, storage and preparation, diet/disease relationships and special attention to folic acid deficiency works to improve diets and pregnancy outcomes. Breastfeeding for infants is promoted by the WIC staff. Support includes breastfeeding education and counseling, instruction on pump usage and milk storage.

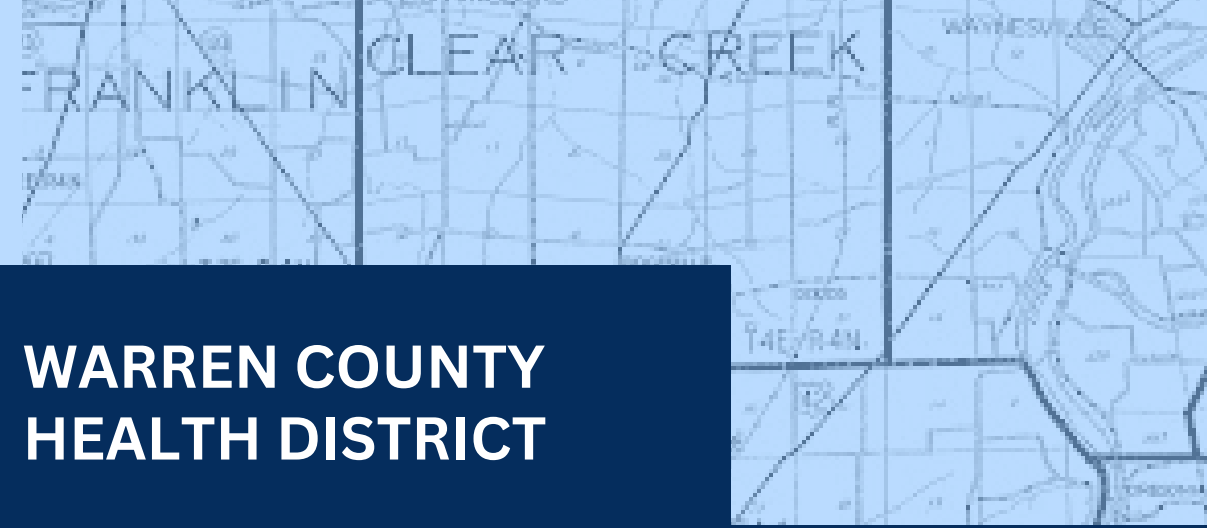
WIC Program offices are located in Lebanon at 416 South East Street and in Franklin at the Conover Health Center, 333 Conover Drive, Suite B.
